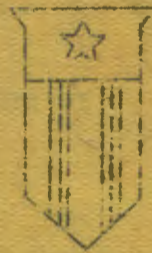

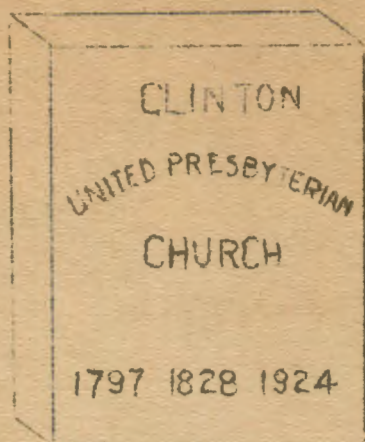

A PAGE OF HISTORY

THOMAS ATEN was born in 1760 in Northampton Co. Pennsylvania. He died in 1855 in the house he built in 1838 which is now occupied by T. M. Cool. He served as a Lieutenant in the 7th Battalion under Capt. Dildine.

JAMES PURDY sailed with his parents and their two children from Ireland in 1770. All but eleven year old James died on board ship. James was one of the soldiers who put in the winter at Valley Forge in 1808.

CHARLES MORGAN with two brothers in the army was taken with the beautiful country in this vicinity. All agreed to return and settle. Charles was the only one who lived to do so. He gave the property upon which the church and cemetery are located. Served in 13th Va. regiment of Militia under Capt. Beelor, in the 2nd Wash. Battalion.

ROBERT AGNEV was born in Ireland in 1757. Served as a private in Capt. John Lacey's Company of the 4th Battalion under Col. Anthony Wayne. Also served under Capt. John Nelson. Was captured at Battle of Three Rivers

BENJAMIN GAUNCE was born in 1759 and died in 1831.
